Good Afternoon Dr. Fauci,

I hope that you are well. It is my understanding that your retirement date will be changing from Dec 31 to Jan 6 or 13. Please let me know the date you have decided upon.

In light of the change in date, please see the following important notes:

- I will need you to re-do **page 1 only** of your retirement application to indicate your new retirement date in **Section B, #2**, and you will also need to re-initial in **Section D, #1** with wet/original initials. To assist, I have completed page 1 of the attached application as much as possible for you. Once you have page 1 ready, let me know, and I will have my colleague, Pandoria King, return to your office to retrieve it for forwarding to me.
- For FERS covered employees, it is normally best to retire on the last day of a month. The retirement date determines the annuity computation start date. If you retire Jan 6 or 13, you will be forfeiting annuity for the month of January. In either case, OPM will calculate your annuity beginning with Feb 1, and your first annuity payment will be due March 1 for the month of February. However, the first annuity payment is normally late, so you will likely receive it around mid-March.
- If you retire Jan 6 or 13, your last NIH paycheck and annual leave lump sum payment will occur on Jan 20. With that being said...working through Jan 13, will mean that you work for the full pay period, and will receive your normal paycheck for that pay period.

Tony,
I have confirmed the processing of your 12/31 retirement personnel action has been stopped and they will change the effective date of your retirement action once the actual date is confirmed. Brenda Fogel (OHR) will need you to obtain your signature on one form. If you are unable to sign electronically while on travel, I have confirmed that it can wait for your return.

As we discussed, your annuity will start to accrue on 2/1 if you retire between 1/1 and 1/31. Under FERS the retirement starts the first day of the month that follows his retirement date. As discussed, I have confirmed that the difference between retiring on 1/6 versus 1/13 would only be that you would receive an additional week of pay. We also need to change your calendar year salary which increased (for the one or two weeks of the calendar year, 2023).

OGC is working to clear the MOU from the USMS. We do not anticipate any issues.
